Accordingly, students will be reading a variety of materials, and you will be responsible as the *expert* for your assigned set of texts. **YOUR TEXTS WILL BE A**MIXTURE OF LITERARY AND NON-LITERARY TEXTS (as this will be our focus in SL English)

- **Literary Texts in this assignment include: poems, short stories, non fiction, and memoir.
- **Non-Literary Texts in this assignment include: cartoons, infographics, Instagram, travel guidebooks, photographs, paintings, advertisements, brochures

YOU WILL ACCESS YOUR ASSIGNED TEXTS ON A SHARED GOOGLE FOLDER. MAKE SURE TO PAY ATTENTION TO YOUR GROUP NUMBER!!! 1. For your **assigned group of texts, read them and write paragraphs for both the literary AND non-literary texts:

A. LITERARY TEXTS--THINK ABOUT THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

- What questions arise when you read the text?
- What main points can you identify?
- Which words or phrases are unfamiliar (define them)?
- What author's choices do you notice
- What are your reactions to the text?

Not, ALL of these questions will be relevant to each literary text but think about which ones are and then from the "Resources" section of the Google folder, consult the handout titled "Five Units of Study." For <u>each</u> of the assigned literary texts, type a paragraph (6-8 sentences) to the following questions. 1) In which of the five units would the text fit best and why? You may discuss how the text would fit in more than one unit. 2) Also, you can address any of the bullets above in your paragraph response about each text. You may use first person "I" in the entry.

B. NON-LITERARY TEXTS--THINK ABOUT THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

- What are the feelings the text evokes? is it persuasive?
- What is the purpose of this text?
- What views are being represented?
- What or whose interests are being served?
- What are the intentions behind the message?
- What cultural assumptions are being taken for granted?
- What or who is absent that one might expect to find

Not, ALL of these questions will be relevant to each non literary text but think about which ones are and then from the "Resources" section in the Google folder, consult the handout titled "Five Units of Study." For <u>each</u> of the assigned non literary texts, type a paragraph (6-8 sentences) to the following question. 1) <u>In which of the five units</u> <u>would the text fit best and why?</u> You may discuss how the text would fit in more than one unit. 2) Also, you can address any of the bullets above in your paragraph response about each text. You may use first person "I" in the entry.

WHEN YOU ARE DONE:

- You should have read both the literary and non-literary texts in your assigned group's folder
- You should have SIX paragraphs typed that respond to the relevant prompts and which of the five units the text would fit in the best and why. These paragraphs should be brought to school the 2nd day. :)
